What Works Well for Self Publishing?

- Teacher resource books (50 Activities to Teach the Present Perfect)& Student Resource Books (How to Study Better)
- · Scholarly Works
- Reading books, workbooks, activity books
- Compilations of student work
- Student-created authentic materials



What Doesn't?

- Large, complicated textbook series (unless you have a team of collaborators or A LOT of time)
- · Lots of high quality art
- DVDs, CDs or other supplemental items
- Alternative shaped items, flashcards (unless you're doing photocopiable materials)

eBook

Reflowable (EPUB, Kindle)

- No control over format, pagination
- No writing
- Unlimited art
- Widely distributed

BOOK FIELD TRIP

This activity is a more in-depth exploration of the book than Book Scan. Use a list of questions to guide your students through their textbook and let them get a sense of what they will be studying and what will be fun or challenging. This activity helps give students ownership of the class.

TIME 20 minutes

MATERIALS The class textbook, a list of questions about the textbook

LANGUAGE Expressing preferences: "I like...", I don't like...", "I need help in..." Expressing expectations and wishes: "I hope that...", "I would like to...", Expressing interest: "I'm interested in..."

Procedure

Before class: prepare a list of questions that will direct students to some of the topics they'll be studying in the class. You can do this in a number of ways:


Direct them to important chapter headings or diagrams. For example, you can ask, "What does the picture in chapter 2, page 23 show?

eBook vs. Paperback (cont'd)

eBook

Fixed (PDF, HTML)

- Total control over format
- Embedded videos, audio, interactive
- Students can write/type
- Fewer distribution channels (TpT, PayHip, own site)



eBook vs. Paperback (cont'd)

Paperback

- Total control over format, pagination
- Can include text, write-in-lines, copyable resources
- Color images get expensive

What are Teamwork Skills?
Employability Skills 2000+ published by the Conference Board of Canada are "the skills you need to enter, stay in, and progress in the world of work—whether you work on your own or as a part of a team. These skills can also be applied and used beyond the workplace in a range of daily activities".

Teamwork skills make up one third of those Key Skills. In fact, teamwork skills are so important to our students' futures, that they are called Employability Skills by the US Department of Education.

The activities in this book target the teamwork skills identified by The Conference Board of Canada. The list below shows the skills most strongly targeted by each activity, although students will be practicing a variety of teamwork skills in every activity.

- 1. Stand up If \dots recognize and respect people's diversity, individual differences, and perspectives
- 2. Getting to Know Your Group recognize and respect people's diversity, individual differences, and perspectives
- Ground Rules understand and work within the dynamics of a group
- Word Lists plan, design, or carry out a project or task from start to finish
- Team Challenge contribute to a team by sharing information and expertise


